<u>CHARITABLE FOUNDATION</u>: The Ontario Command Branches and Ladies Auxiliaries Charitable Foundation, a registered Charity, is a partnership of the Branches of the Royal Canadian Legion and Auxiliaries in Ontario Command Foundation funds are used to support programs such as the provincial bursaries, medical equipment, medical research and programs for aging veterans. This program is open to fund medical equipment for hospitals, not-for-profit homes, Hospices, Fire Stations. District G has representation on the Foundation Board. Renfrew Branch donated \$2,000.00 to assist this program. Deadline for applications is April 26, 2024.

POPPY TRUST COMMITTEE: The Poppy year is now January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023. Our 2023 Poppy Campaign generated income of \$31,818.45 plus donations of \$2,354.65. The generosity of our members and the greater Renfrew Community will allow us to donate funds to the Ottawa Veterans Service Fund, District G Veterans Care Fund, Perley Heath Center, along with various other Veteran programs; Provincial Bursary Program, Charitable Foundation. Branch Bursaries will be available to grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Veterans. Veterans living in long term care homes or being care for in their own homes were given Christmas care gifts. We have some outstanding wreath/crosses invoices, which we hope to, recover soon. In early January a detailed Branch Poppy inventory was completed.
