FINANCE: Auditorium has many bookings; bar sales are so/so. The lounge continues to struggle, the last few Thursdays and a couple Saturdays we didn't have enough sales to pay the bartenders. This will be a topic at the next executive meeting. The weather hasn't been in our favour for the patio either. Total debt as of May 28, 2025, is \$47k. The Ontario Trillium grant to renovate (total makeover) the women's and men's bathrooms was denied. There is now a new rental agreement put in place with the Chip Stand. A new 3-year contract with Cogeco put in place, and the LA phone and Lounge phone lines have been disconnected. However, office phone is linked to lounge. This contact was negotiated a better price, a savings of \$224 a month plus an additional credit of \$50 for the next 5 months. The bar inventory has been completed.

Upcoming: We will be taking part in this December's holiday campaign (Smile Cookie) thanks to Richard Dean from the Renfrew Tim Hortons. It's a joint smile cookie campaign, which could bring in 8-10K for our branch. Comrade Debbie advised that she has already been in touch with the Renfrew Wolves, who are on board for volunteering, and Comrade Jessica may reach out to the air cadets as well. Richard and I will be meeting on June 3rd to discuss details. I am still working on the budget for next Fiscal Year and will introduce more ways to make money and/or make cuts. Increasing our debt can no longer be an option. We are still trying to find new ways to get patrons in the lounge and open more days on a volunteer basis, and we are continuing to advertise for more volunteers to work the bar and help with fundraising events. We will be reviewing the Snow removal contract. I have been keeping track of costs versus profit to understand where changes are needed. We also need to find new ways to utilize the lounge more.

CHIEF BAR STEWARD REPORT: We have been advertising for some more volunteer bar stewards to open the lounge more. 3 individuals have inquired so far. We will be open July 1 this year, there will be music, games and a barbeque.
